Initial aero-medical examination for class 1 medical certificate

General

For the initial issue of medical certificate, you must contact Aero-medical Center – AeMC certified by Croatian Civil Aviation Agency or other EU Member State's Competent authority. Certified Aero-medical centers in Croatia are Zavod za zrakoplovnu medicinu - Zagreb and Poliklinika "Dr Ercegović" – Split. You may find their contact details at CCAA web page, www.ccaa.hr. Aero-medical examinations are performed by certified Aero-medical Examiner-AME.

Applicants for class 1 medical certificate shall have identification document containing photograph (passport or national ID card) with them and bring reports from specialists and health care professionals related to any significant past medical conditions. At the AeMC's the applicant will complete and sign Application form which contains declaration on medical history and relevant medical facts.

Applicants for class 1 medical certificate shall be assessed according to detailed medical requirements in Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/27.

Content and procedure

Initial examination includes: medical history, clinical examination, ophthalmological examination-eyesight, color vision tests, ENT examination with audiometry, chest X ray, psychological testing and mental health assessment, drugs (opioids, cannabis, amphetamines, cocaine, hallucinogens, sedatives and hypnotics) and alcohol testing.

After the examination and testing are concluded applicant will be declared fit, fit with limitations or unfit.

Any complex cases, and/or where referral to the licensing authority is mandatory, or where applicant wishes to formally appeal to an unfit assessment (which may be done within 15 days from receiving letter of denial), further assessment will be done by CCAA Medical assessor or Medical assessor of the other EU Member State Licensing Authority (in cases when other EU competent authority is the licensing authority).
